7 Kramsach



In the largest open-air museum in Tyrol you have the possibility to get a general idea of authentic Tyrolean farmsteads from different epochs. It shows how life of the Tyrolean farmers developed during the centuries. The aim of this special museum is to preserve architecture and

rural life-style.

10 Innsbruck



The busy capital of Tyrol is characterized by the impressive scenery of the mountain chain Karwendel. The picturesque Old Town (pedestrian precinct) holds, apart from many other sights, the medieval "Golden Roof". Also worth a visit is the Court Palace, in which's chapel you can see the "Black Men" bronze statues. For the ones who feel a thirst for knowledge Innsbruck offers a wide range of museums.

5 Kitzbühel



Every winter Kitzbühel becomes a mecca for many ski enthusiasts. Guests from all over the world come to see the well known Hahnenkamm Race, one of the most treacherous and most famous of all the downhill races on the World Cup circuit. Each year at the end of July, the Austrian Open Men's Tennis Championship (Generali Open) comes to town. This interesting mixture of Tyrolean tradition and the flair of a cosmopolitan city is well worth a visit.

8 Silver mine Schwaz



Centuries ago Schwaz was a rich town which acquired standing and greatness by mining silver and copper. Today you can visit the mine by way of the mine train and experience the harsh conditions of the past. The journey back in time is an unforgettable adventure for both, the young and the old. Also worth a visit is Tyrol's biggest Gothic Hall Church in the Old Town of Schwaz and the Planetarium.

11 Großglockner



The best way to get an impression of Austria's highest mountain, the Großglockner (3.798 m), is on the Großglockner High Alpine Road. The road leads you from Zell am See to the viewing point Edelweißspitz (2.571 m). For the ones who want to experience the Großglockner on the calmer southern side, it is to be recommended to take the ascent from Heiligenblut via Salm-Hütte (2.638 m) or via Stüdl-Hütte (2.802 m).

6 Rattenberg

With only a population of 440, this medieval spot is the smallest town in Austria. It was first documented in 1254. Being one of the few cities with a well preserved medieval townscape, Rattenberg has a very special flair. In the 19th century several glassblowers settled down near the glazier's workshop in Kramsach which had a 300 years glassblowing tradition. Today the town is the centre of the Tyrolean glass blowers.

9 Wattens



52 km

Worth a visit are the Swarovski Crystal Worlds, created by the famous Austrian artist André Heller. They hold a unique mysterious world full of wonders and fantastical games around the crystal. The visitor enters the Swarovski Crystal World through the mouth of a giant and lives an incomparable experience of sounds, scents and lights.

12 Salzwelten Hallein



Salt of Mount Dürrnberg is what gave the city and the state its name. Prince Archbishop Wolf Dietrich von Raitenau guides you through the Worlds of Salt and tells you about the "White Gold", which was already mined 2.500 years ago by the ancient Celts. The salt was the Prince Archbishop's means to make Salzburg one of the most beautiful cities in the world.

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
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

1 Salzburg

Being Mozart's birth place, this town holds international reputation and still today Mozart's spirit seems to glide through the streets and lanes. Apart from the Residence, the House of Nature and the Castle Hellbrunn, Salzburg Cathedral is without doubt the main attraction in the Old Town.

2 Krimmler Waterfalls



With an elevation difference of 390 m, the Krimmler waterfalls are the highest in Europe and a symbol for all the beauty spots of the Nationalpark Hohe Tauern. For more than 100 years the waterfall path has lead to many viewing points and bridges, taking the enthusiasts of nature very closely to the nature spectacle.

3 Wildlife Park Aurach



10 - 15 km

A very special experience for adults and children is the Wildlife Park in Aurach, near Kitzbühel. In 1080 m above sea level you will find most local wildlife. During a walk through the largest wildlife park (about 40 ha) you can observe deer, lynx, ibex and wild pig.
